Note CLASS 55:

MIXED VASE CLASS: a glass container of any shape but with a maximum height of 20cm containing five to ten stems, taken from a minimum of two different kinds of plants (two varieties of the same flower is not acceptable).

- plants used must be showing flowers only;
- foliage, growing naturally from and attached to the flowering stem, is allowed;
- no seed heads or berries are allowed;
- packing material – excluding floral foam – to keep the stems in place is allowed;
- no marks are awarded for the choice of container;
- no accessories such as bows, tape, additional foliage are allowed.

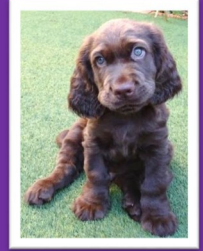

Rules of the Show

The Show will be conducted in accordance with the rules and standards laid down in the Horticultural Show Handbook 2016, issued by the Royal Horticultural Society, except where stated in this Schedule. A copy of the Horticultural Show Handbook may be seen on application to the Show Manager.

Where multiple entrants obtain equal highest points in any one Division, the Judge will award the Trophy to the entrant who, in the Judge's opinion, has achieved the best overall results in that Division. Where a Trophy is awarded for the second highest number of points, this rule will also apply.

Exhibitors may only enter ONE exhibit per class.

Entries in Divisions A, B, C and D (Fruit, Vegetables, Roses, Flowers and Plants) must have been grown by the exhibitor in their own allotment, garden, glasshouse or home for at least the current season. Unless otherwise stated, all exhibits in Divisions A, B, C and D must consist of one cultivar / variety. Pot plants must have been in the possession of the exhibitor for at least six months.

Entries in Division H (Arts and Crafts) must have been created by the exhibitor within one year of the Show.

Volunteers will be on duty in the Village Hall during the afternoon but entries are left at exhibitors' own risk.

No entries will be accepted after 5pm on Thursday 2nd July 2026

The staging of the exhibits will take place in the Village Hall on the morning of the Show from 8am to 10am. *It will not be possible to stage any exhibits in the Village Hall on Friday evening.* Exhibits must be staged by 10am; all exhibitors must then leave the Village Hall until the Show is opened at 1.30pm. Please note that no containers or accessories are supplied for any class.

Exhibits may be collected between 4.15pm and 4.45pm.

Prizes If an exhibit qualifies for a prize, points will be awarded as follows:

1st prize	3 points
2nd prize	2 points
3rd prize	1 point

Where no exhibit in a class merits an award, no points will be given; when a prize is shared, the prize winners will each receive the points applicable to the prize.

Prize money can be collected from the Village Hall between 4pm and 4.45pm. Prize money not collected will be donated to Gala funds.

Hints and Tips for All

JUNIOR CLASSES

Please label exhibits on the reverse side or base with your name, date of birth, school year and the number of the class you are entering. Originality and creativity will be rewarded as well as technical skill.

FRUIT

Gooseberries, raspberries, currants, loganberries, blueberries and strawberries should be picked with a good piece of stalk attached, and are best cut with scissors. Raspberries are shown complete with plug. Currants should include all the berries on the string.

PRESERVES/JAMS

These must state type, month and year. Jars to be filled to within 3mm of top (fill to the top to allow for shrinkage). Jars should be sealed—any unbranded top acceptable.

CHUTNEY/PICKLES

Must be at least **six to eight weeks** old before showing. All must have vinegar-proof seal, e.g. glass or plastic lid or screw top, not cellophane jam pot cover. All preserve jars for showing should have clear sides, not ribbed, and no brand names or numbers on them.

HOME BAKING

Please list all ingredients and quantities on an accompanying card. Cakes should **not** show marks on surface from cooking rack. All home baked food items should be covered either with a removable lid or a cellophane or plastic cover.

FLORAL ARRANGEMENTS

No floral foam (Oasis) but other means of support, eg chicken wire, flower frogs, pebbles etc, are acceptable except where specified.

PHOTOGRAPHY

Photographs can be mounted but the maximum size **includes** the mount.

Your name will be displayed on your entry card on the table alongside your exhibit. This card is destroyed at the end of the Show. We do not sell personal details to third parties.

We need your contact details to process your entry and, should you win a prize or trophy, to communicate with you about this. We also use your contact details to send you a personal copy of the Gala schedule in subsequent years. If you do not wish us to retain your contact details, please let the Show Manager know; however, this will of course mean that you cannot take away any trophy that you win (trophy winners keep the cup they win until the next Show). Winners names are engraved on the Trophy won and included in the list of Trophy Winners in our official communication channels.

This is no change from the way we have used your names and contact details over the past 100 years and, unless you specifically notify us, we shall assume that you are happy for this to continue.
